Kelly Moore Recently Invited To Meet With Massachusetts Congressman

Massachusetts Congressman Jim McGovern recently met with Friends of the World Food Program Community Delegate and founder of Music For Mankind* Kelly Moore. The two met in Washington, DC on Wednesday, Sept. 10.
